





" The temporalities of practice-based research "

Call for proposals – European Summer School of the Creation, Arts and Media Network (RESCAM)

Grenoble - June 3 to 5, 2020

The next edition of the RESCAM European Summer School will be held from June 3 to 5, 2020 at the new Maison de la Création et de l'Innovation of Université Grenoble Alpes (Grenoble, France). The event will bring together PhD students, artists, artists-scholars and academics for a three-day conference of seminars, presentations and debates, focusing on the specificity of temporality, experimentation, creation, transcription and transmission and artistic research.

The 2020 edition questions the ways in which temporalities of different artistic practices influence practice-based research at the doctoral level. We can find rhythmic diversity in the process of experimentation, reflexive approaches, between artistic practices and disciplinary fields, as well as with the public and researchers. The doctorate being a diploma, the peer evaluation also imposes an institutional temporality. The peer review nature of doctoral studies also imposes an institutional temporality.

Within the context of the conference, we will focus on the following questions:

- How should specific rhythms within a given artistic practice be considered in the doctoral research process?
- How do artistic practices (visual arts, dance, music, theater, literature, cinema, circus, etc.) structure and shape the temporalities of creative research?
- How do we consider the temporalities of the curatorial act and the editorial activity of the doctoral thesis?
- How do we associate the temporal conditions of the creative process that develops during doctoral research?
- How do we associate the temporal conditions during doctoral research with pre-existing creative works?

> Call for proposals :

The doctoral schools of RESCAM invite national and European PhD students to respond to the Summer School 2020 call. This will be an opportunity for young researchers to value their research conducted within the context of their thesis research (in the form of text, audio, video, podcast, or performance), to exchange with experts in the fileds and to meet with other PhD students involved in the field of practice-based research.

The contributions will take the form of interventions of twenty minutes maximum.

> Application:

- A presentation of the candidate: NAME / First name / University affiliation / Doctoral School / Research Team / Thesis Subject / Thesis Director,
- A curriculum vitae (2 pages maximum),
- A proposal summary of the project including 5 key words (1 page maximum)
- A letter of support from the thesis director,
- The technical requirements (1 page maximum).

Any incomplete file will be rejected.

> Timeline:

- Please send your proposals to the scientific committee before January 20, 2020 at rescam.ed@gmail.com
- Successful applications will be announced mid-February 2020.
- Conference: June 3-5, 2020.

> Conditions for accepted proposals:

Accomodation costs for candidates whose proposals have been selected are covered by the Summer School.

Transport costs need to be covered by the PhD student (some doctoral schools or laboratories offer financial aid: you can get more information from your home university).
